We see then that a long time and a "little while" are accommodative terms, to be understood in harmony with the standpoint of the one using them. When Paul used these words he was God's mouthpiece, therefore the word is God's, and it is from His standpoint, in whose sight "a thousand years are but as yesterday," and "as a watch in the night." If we remember that He is from everlasting to everlasting\*, we can readily see, that eighteen hundred years, (now 1900), are but "a little while" to Him. In His sight it is only "a little while" since He created Adam.
